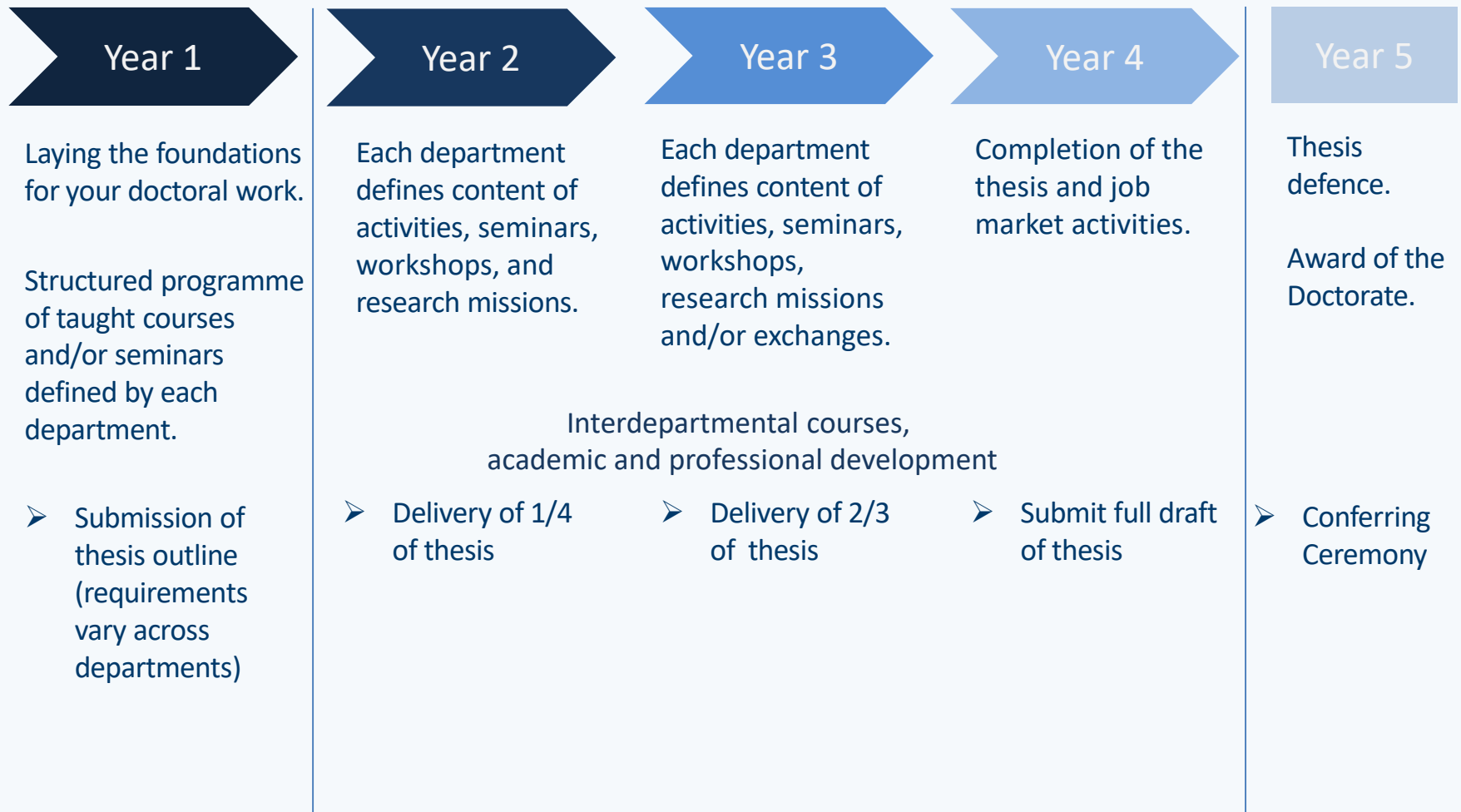
Fully-funded four-year doctoral programmes

A **Master of Research or Master of Laws** (M.Res/LLM) degree is awarded upon completion of the M.Res or LLM requirements during the first year of the doctoral programme.

Structured doctoral study

- Close doctoral supervision with regular monitoring to assess teaching and quality of supervision
- Doctoral programme governed by:
 - Academic Rules and Regulations
 - Code of Supervision
 - Code of Ethics in Academic Research
 - Data Protection Practice in Research

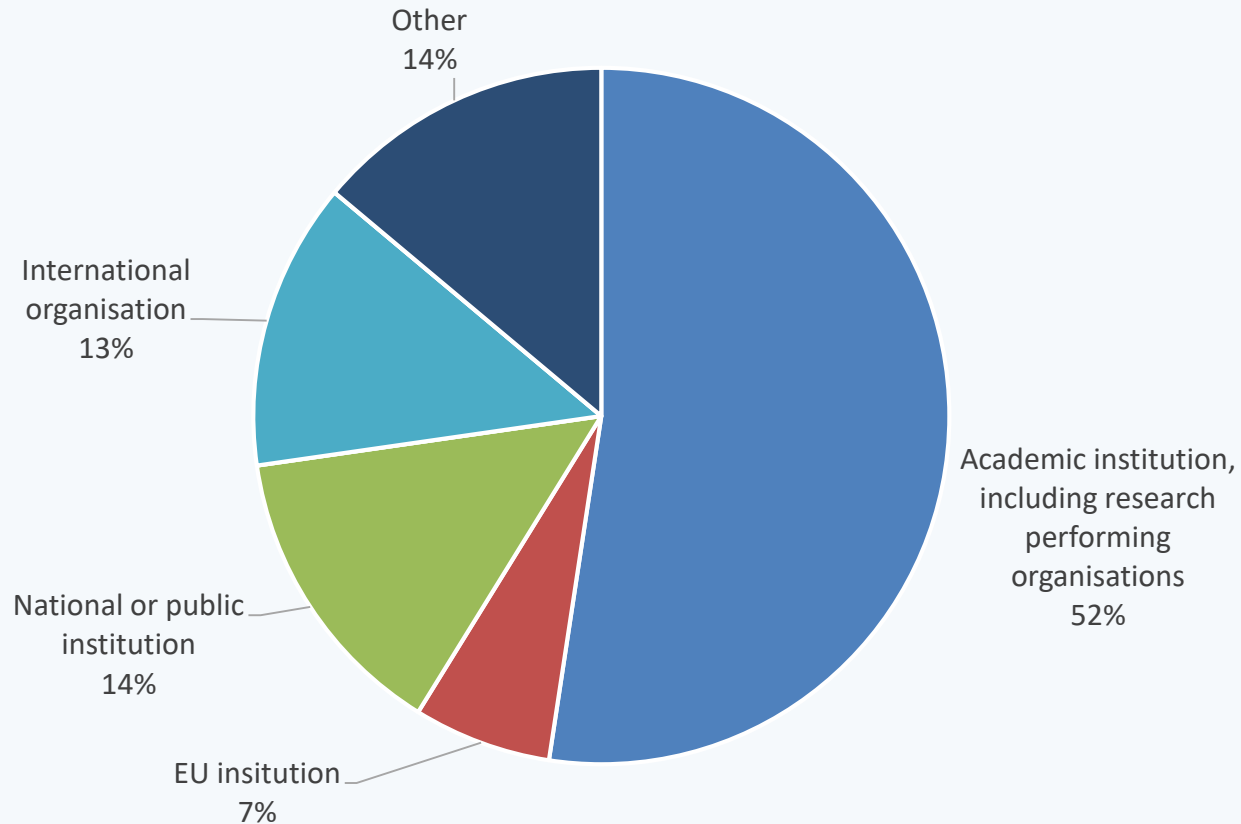

- 30% are employed in senior positions, such as full professors



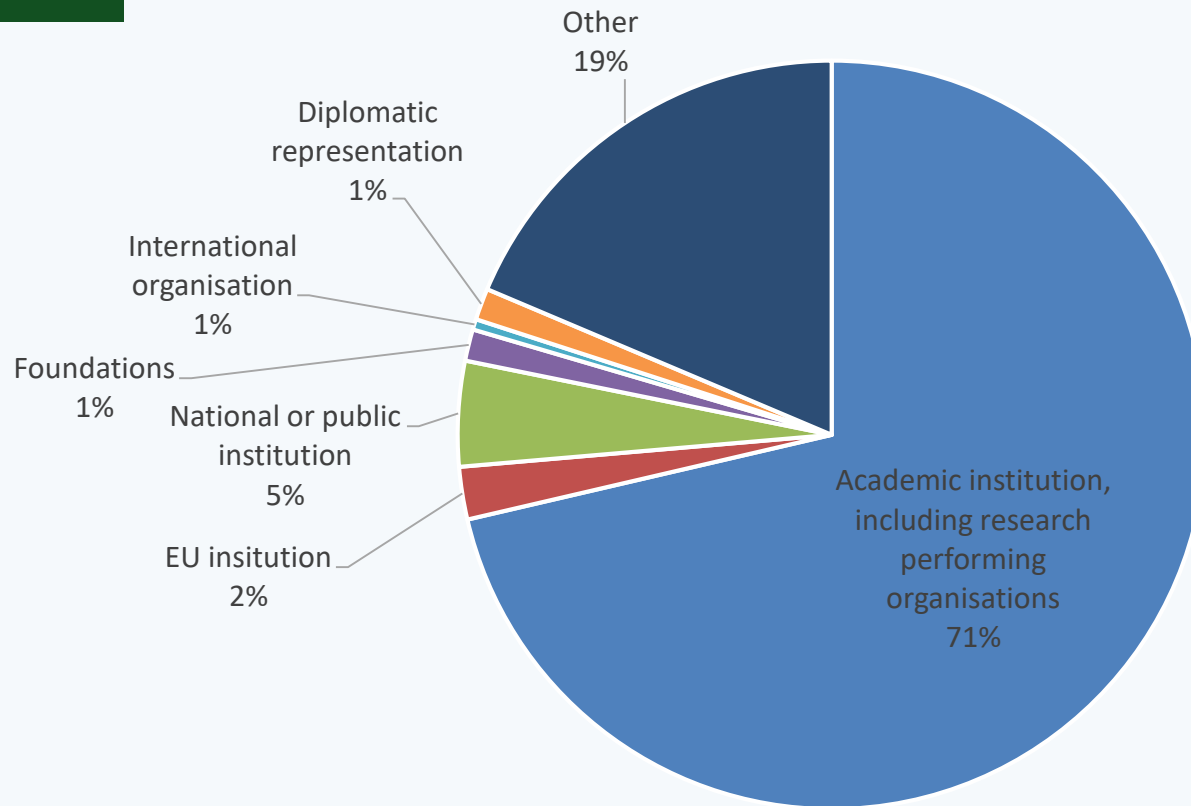
Career path of alumni

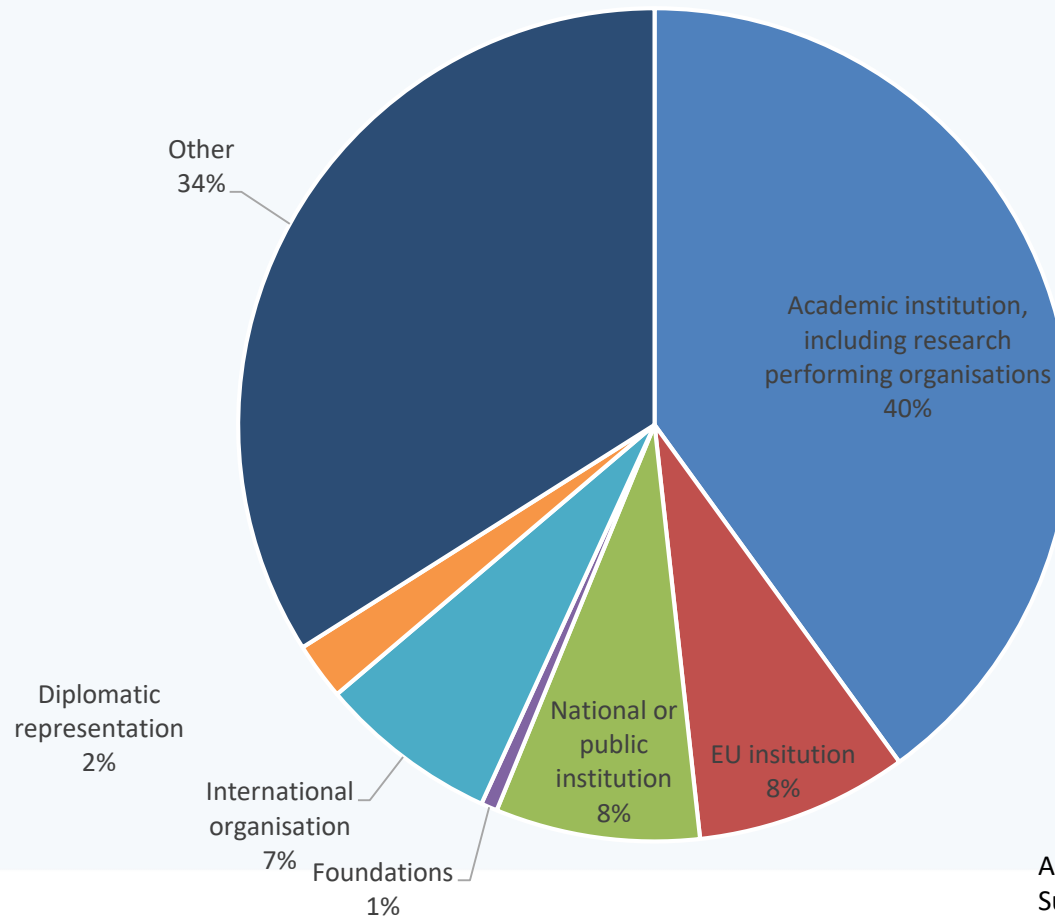
Career path of alumni

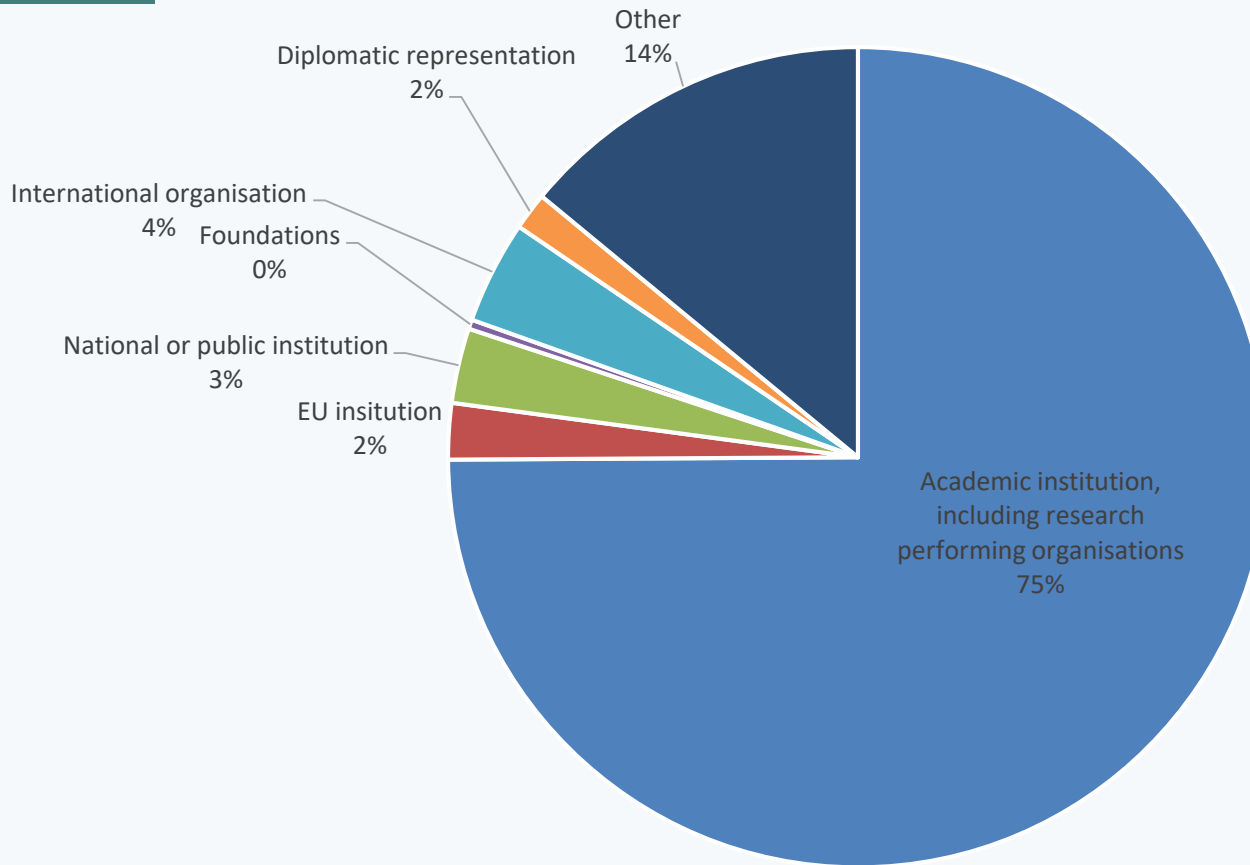
Career path of alumni
